



Santa Cruz/Silicon Valley New Teacher Project (SC/SVNTP) 2019-20 Site Administrator Agreements



The Santa Cruz/Silicon Valley New Teacher Project (SC/SVNTP) is a state-accredited Induction provider that collaborates with districts and charters to provide a two-year, individualized, job-embedded induction program to support teachers and serve as the pathway to clear preliminary teaching credentials. Guided by the California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTP), highly trained mentors meet weekly with Participating Teachers (PTs) to refine teaching practices based on data and develop habits of mind that promote equity and positive learning experiences for all students.

Administrators play a critical role in supporting new teacher development and retention through:

1. Creating a caring climate and culture that values ongoing learning and authentic collaboration;
2. Collaborating with mentors to support participating teachers in aligning goals, processes, and resources; sharing successes and challenges; and tailoring Induction to meet school/teacher needs; and
3. Recognizing that participating teachers are new to the profession and are at early phases of developing as professional educators

In accordance with the California Induction Standards and our partnership with the SC/SVNTP, I agree to:

1. Respect the non-evaluative and confidential nature of the Mentor-Participating Teacher relationship;
2. Provide input into the development of the Participating Teacher's Individual Learning Plan (ILP) within the first 60 days of enrollment in the Induction program;
3. Meet quarterly with mentor(s) and at least one time as a triad with the mentor and participating teacher, to refine Participating Teacher(s) Individual Learning Plan goals, align Induction work with district/site goals and resources, provide formative feedback, and learn about Induction work;
4. Honor time (not less than one hour per week) for Mentor-Participating Teacher interactions, observations of colleagues, and other activities contained in the Individual Learning Plan;
5. Support Participating Teachers' use of secure classroom video as a component of the induction process; and
6. Offer a site orientation for new teachers at the beginning of the school year.
